### **A** ACCOUNTING I **B.V.A.** 631 1 credit

This full-year accounting course is designed to give students a background of basic accounting principles used to operate a business. Proficiency in math skills is recommended to succeed in this class. The accounting procedures presented will also serve as a background for employment in office jobs and preparation for studying business and academic courses in college.

**DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:** Basic math skills

### **A** FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING 632 1 credit

This course is designed to provide a conceptual introduction to financial accounting for business and accounting majors. Emphasis in the course is placed on using financial accounting information for decision making. Accounting theory of all commonly used accounts such as cash, investments, receivables, inventory, fixed and intangible assets, payables, bonds, and stocks are studied, as are accounting systems and controls, financial statement preparation, and analysis. Students will be introduced to the accounting cycle through computerized software. Completion of summer work is required to begin the course in the fall. This 1.0 credit course meets every day for an entire year and fulfills the computer graduation requirement.

**DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:** Completion of Algebra I with a grade of C or higher and completion of Accounting I with a grade of C or higher. You can bypass Accounting I with a personal recommendation from two teachers. See Mr. Moulin for more details.

**FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT** 605 .5 credit

Do you want to have financial freedom someday? Imagine owning your own home. Financial Management will help students explore everyday business transactions for the individual. The topics of discussion will prepare students to be responsible for their own financial health. Various electronic resources will be used to emphasize the role of the consumer in our society and develop practical decision-making skills for the future. Special emphasis is placed on the consumer activities of buying, saving, borrowing, investing, and insuring.

**WEB DESIGN** 650 .5 credit

Are you interested in creating your own personal website? Students in this course will focus on the fundamentals of web design and the overall production processes surrounding web site design. The first stage of this class concentrates on the academic theory and guidelines involved in web design using the Cashman textbook. As the class progresses, emphasis on design elements involving layout, navigation, and interactivity will be discussed. The “hands-on” portion of this class includes instruction in HTML and Dreamweaver to design web pages. Students will create their very own site demonstrating their unique talents and the skills they have acquired in this class.

**DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDATION:** Proficient typing skills and intermediate computer skills required in both Windows and Word.
