

1. **How long will we be out of school?**

It is difficult to say, but as of now, school buildings will reopen at the Governor's decision.

2. **Will there be printed packets every week**

We will not be providing supplementary packets the way we did the first two weeks of our closure. Teachers will try to minimize printed materials, but there are times that you may be asked to print some materials.

3. **Will there be any Face to Face Instruction?**

The DBASD will not be recording video conferences between teachers and students as it raises several legal issues around privacy. We ask that families also, do not take photos or screenshots of video conferences where other students or staff members can be viewed, as it violates students' and staff members' rights to privacy.

4. **Will there be One-On-One/Small Group Instruction?**

Yes, Please note that some students will have access to/receive virtual services or other contacts from school staff on a one -on-one basis during this period of closure. These contacts will be recorded and maintained as part of the confidential education record of the student. The district will not allow access to or disclosure of any such recording in any manner inconsistent with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). 5. **How do I communicate with my child's teacher, school counselor, or principal?** You may reach out directly through email. Our faculty is checking email routinely and will respond within 24 hours, if not sooner. Teachers will also be establishing "office hours," during which students can speak with them via Google Classroom, Schoology or conference call.

6. **Will student assignments be graded?**

Teachers will assign Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grades at the elementary level during remote learning in the 3rd Trimester. We are encouraging teachers to provide feedback when possible.

7. **Will student attendance matter?**

Yes. Beginning April 14th, attendance will be taken in several ways. Daily attendance will occur each day during homeroom period. Teachers will count students present as work is posted in Google Classroom or Schoology, or, they can confirm attendance via email from a parent/caregiver.

10. **What will be the last day of school for students?**
